NHCS developed a Remodelling Index to determine the 'tipping point' of heart muscle thickening before heart functions deteriorate.

This is one of the research studies that NHCS has embarked with the aim to identify those who are at risk or are in the early stages of cardiometabolic disorders. Such medical research studies enhance our understanding of how cardiovascular diseases develop in Asian population, and drive new discoveries and treatments for better health outcomes.

Studies have suggested that having fat surrounding and inside organs such as the liver is strongly linked to diabetes and heart disease.

More research can be done to find the answers and better understand the health implications of internal body fat.

Mr Ng can now spend time playing with his one-year old granddaughter and continue with his religious volunteering.

Just two years ago, Mr Ng's life was on the line. "For years, I suffered regular episodes of asthma attacks and breathlessness; constantly in and out of hospital. It was only later that doctors found out my issue was not due to my weak lungs but a heart problem."

Mr Ng was diagnosed with damaged heart valve and was told that he had only a 50 per cent chance to live past one year.

Transcatheter Aortic Valve Implantation (TAVI) - a minimally invasive procedure to repair his damaged heart valve was his only treatment option.

The decision was hard for Mr Ng's two sons who were financially strapped with unstable employment and income, "We are grateful to NHCS Heart To Heart Fund for the help in subsidising the treatment cost."
